A letter from the Executive Director.

TO OUR DEAR SUPPORTERS, AUDIENCES, ARTISTS, VOLUNTEERS, AND COMMUNITY...

The regional premiere of the Broadway musical *Amazing Grace* was supposed to be one of the many highlights of 2020 for Servant Stage. The postponement was just one of many disappointments in a challenging year. It would be easy to focus on those disappointments and challenges, but instead, we return to that phrase "amazing grace" (just as we also plan to return to a wonderful production of *Amazing Grace* in the upcoming season).

Ernest Hemingway says that "Courage is grace under pressure," and I am so grateful for the grace that the Servant Stage community has displayed under tremendous pressure in 2020. Grace (from the Latin gratis) is such a rich word, with connotations including Favor, Gift, Gratitude, Generosity, Help, Embellish, and Beauty; all meanings that we have found important to Servant Stage this year.

As our community has faced so much unexpected adversity this year, we believed that the inspiration, beauty, and hope found through the arts and Servant Stage's mission to "inspire, educate, challenge, and entertain" was more needed than ever. Our vision has always been to make the arts accessible to people where they are at. So with both our audiences and performers stuck at home, we worked harder than ever this past year to create new ways to connect and bring the arts to our community.

Our team tackled every challenge we faced and found so many new opportunities to continue serving our community creatively. Though we did experience loss, we also experienced incredible grace, gratitude, gifts, and growth.

We had to cancel over 150 performances and truly missed seeing an expected 60,000 audience members in person, but we are so grateful for the growth we saw in online engagement with more than 340,000 views of Servant Stage videos in 2020!

With the cancelation of so many productions we lost over \$300,000 in projected revenue, but thanks to the generosity of our Servant Stage community we managed to finish the year without a loss, and are in a great position for a successful 2021 season.

In the face of many obstacles, hardships, uncertainties, and circumstances beyond our control, our team responded with amazing grace under pressure, and created so many beautiful gifts for the community through the *Living Room Concert Series*, Teen Company, Apprentice Company, and online conSERVANTory programs.

We don't take any of this for granted. As we look across the community and country, we see so many theaters that have been forced to shut down completely, many for at least a year, some permanently. We are so incredibly grateful for the gracious gifts that have continued to pour in from the Servant Stage community, making it possible for us to continue gracing the stage with virtual performances, concerts, classes, and training. Through your generosity, we have been able to continue offering these gifts gratis to the community. It is because of the contributions of each and every one of you that Servant Stage is able to continue having such a dramatic impact on all stages of life in our community!

OUR SEASON

From the moment we announced our season plans for 2020, we were extremely excited about what was in store. We were looking forward to presenting some of the biggest and most challenging productions in our history. We were eager to see the next steps in the growth of our youth theatre come to fruition. It had all the signs of becoming one of our best seasons yet.

We began the year by welcoming 50 students into our first ever winter youth production, *Frozen Jr.* Several weeks of rehearsals and a sold out weekend of performances started the year off with a bang. Next, we launched into rehearsals for *Don't Rock the Jukebox* with a cast of 30 incredible teen performers. We were days away from opening the show when the world around us changed, and our course shifted dramatically. While a majority of our 2020 season would look nothing like we so eagerly anticipated, what took place over the next 9 months was remarkable and in my opinion proved to still be one of our best seasons yet.

OUR STAFF & PERFORMERS

When we realized that the theatre world was coming to a halt, we immediately started brainstorming about what we needed to do to continue the mission of Servant Stage. Every single person on our staff jumped in and immediately began learning new skills and tackling uncharted territory. It took literally hundreds of people sharing their time, talents, and gifts in order to make these virtual concerts happen. We were even able to feature and hear from artists all over the country, performing in our *Living Room Concert Series* as well as teaching in our online theatre classes. We are so thankful for our network of amazing, caring, and supportive performers, musicians, and teachers.

OUR YOUTH THEATRE

Having to cancel many of our youth productions and projects was truly devastating. It not only put the brakes on the most rapidly growing area of our company, but took away something from our young performers that they so desperately needed during this season in their lives. But, like every step of the way, we refused to simply give up. We created an online conSERVANTory, which provided 8 weeks of virtual classes that students of any age could attend in order to stay engaged, encouraged, and active in their love of theatre. We launched the first semester of our Teen Company and Apprentice Company, which included 38 amazingly talented teens. Even being online, we could not be more proud of what they were able to accomplish. We still saw tremendous growth in this youth program even in the midst of this challenging time.

OUR AUDIENCES

Our audiences proved more loyal, faithful, hopeful, enthusiastic, and supportive than ever before. As much as our community needed us this year, we needed our community just as much. You continued to show up, to tune in virtually, to encourage us and lift us up. The Servant Stage family is not limited to staff or cast or crew, but it is all of us, and the strength of this family persevered through what was an incredibly difficult season.

OUR FUTURE

As I look back on the year, I am saddened by the loss of so many opportunities, but am so incredibly grateful for the many opportunities that came out of this season. Like the theatre industry, we WILL be back, and like always, Servant Stage WILL continue to serve. We cannot wait to get this next year started, and welcome you back into the theatre. Whatever it takes, we will continue finding ways to reach and support our community, and to be a constant in this great arts community. In the coming year we will move forward with great anticipation and expectation as we continue to grow, to learn, to listen, and to serve.





Financial STATEMENT

Servant Stage Company is carefully managed and has never run a deficit since its creation, with a sustainable vision for the future to serve our community for generations to come.

Our fiscal year closed on Dec. 31, 2020 with \$368,584 in assets (\$5,140 in equipment, \$363,444 in cash, including \$99,158 in restricted income towards a future home for Servant Stage). Our income for 2020 was \$409,741 against \$335,998 in expenses.




Beginning unofficially in 2011, Johnathan and Rebecca Bauer would get groups of friends together to rehearse and put on free performances for local retirement homes.

The 2015 season included our first Broadway musical, as well as the original production of our recurring audience favorite, A Christmas Carol.










In 2016, Wally Calderon joined the staff as a full-time Artistic Director and Servant Stage offered its first summer youth theatre camp.
