A letter from the Executive Director.

TO OUR DEAR SUPPORTERS, AUDIENCES, ARTISTS, VOLUNTEERS, AND COMMUNITY...

2022 was a wonderful bounce back year of growth for Servant Stage. After persisting through setbacks and challenges over the past few years of the pandemic, we celebrated our 10th anniversary season with a record-setting year!

It was wonderful to see audiences (new and old!) returning to the theatre in greater numbers, and to be able to bring our touring performances back into local retirement homes and more schools than ever before. Our youth theatre programs continued their momentum, with record numbers of students participating in our camp productions, youth companies, and weekly classes!

I am so thankful for all of the shared experiences we have enjoyed together in 2022 and over these past 10 years, for each success and each lesson learned along the way! It is a joy to serve this wonderful community together!

Our goal has always been to have something for everyone in our community each season, and we hope that we had something to inspire, educate, challenge, and entertain our diverse audiences in 2022! Our mainstage season opened with *Songs For A New World*, featuring a small powerhouse cast of dynamic performers and musicians. This modern musical was a moving collection of songs, examining the choices we make and their consequences. This was followed by *Newsies*, a fun and inspirational story showcasing the talents of a large and energetic cast. We toured across Lancaster County throughout the summer with *Rock Around The Clock* bringing back memories from the greatest hits of the 50s and 60s and introducing a new generation to old-time rock'n'roll. In the fall, we brought our most ambitious production yet to Lancaster, the powerful Broadway musical *Ragtime*, a truly unique and powerful portrait of America. We closed out the year with our original adaptation of Dickens' *A Christmas Carol*, creatively sharing this classic story at 20 different venues across Lancaster County.

Our youth theatre programs saw record growth and attendance in 2022! Our goal has been to be able to offer opportunities year-round for students of all ages. We opened the year with two youth productions, both a contemporary musical (*Matilda Jr*) and a classic play (*Our Town*) for students ages 8-19. With our mission to make the arts accessible to everyone, we offered pay-what-you-will theatre classes every Monday night from February to November! Nearly 400 students of all ages attended these classes, studying acting, dancing, singing, stagecraft, and a wide variety of theatre-related classes. Another 40 students were selected to be part of our Youth Companies, for students considering pursuing theatre beyond high school. 150 students took part in our summer camp productions of *Frozen Jr*, *Annie Jr*, and *Lion King Jr*. At both the beginning and the end of 2022 we were able to share educational performances of *Lift Ev'ry Voice* and *A Christmas Carol* with more than a dozen schools across Lancaster County.

For all of this, we say "Thank you!" As the only Pay-What-You-Will theatre in the region, none of what we do is possible without you! So thank you for spreading the word to your friends and families! Thank you for supporting Servant Stage with your generosity and friendship, and thank you for allowing us to continue to grow and expand our impact on the community! Thank you for playing your role with Servant Stage!




THE WORL

Our fiscal year closed on Dec. 31, 2022 with \$540,868 in assets (\$9,841 in equipment, \$531,027 in cash). Our income for 2022 was \$717,660 against \$700,034 in expenses.



Though Servant Stage relies heavily on volunteers, whenever possible our goal is to offer stipends. In 2022, Servant Stage was able to offer **\$156,574** *in stipends to 168 independent contractors*



We're so very grateful for the community that is Servant Stage. It truly "takes a village" to bring a Servant Stage show from concept to stage so that over 40,000 audience members may enjoy performances.

As we begin our 11th season of pay-what-you-will-shows, we wanted to make you aware of some larger needs we have for this year. Currently, our staff members (and sometimes cast, crew and kind volunteers) use their own vehicles to transport costumes, sets and audio equipment to venues across Lancaster County. To properly (and safely!) transport these items, we're in need of a company van. We'd love to be able to place sponsor names on the van to let the county know of your generosity. We estimate the cost of this van to be \$30,000 - \$40,000.

Additionally, our audio equipment is in need of quite an upgrade to ensure we present quality shows that all can understand and enjoy. We anticipate the audio equipment to cost \$25,000 - \$30,000.
